The Aim High program is part of the New York Life Foundation's ongoing investment in middle school OST programs to help economically disadvantaged eighth-graders reach ninth grade on time. The grant program will fund a total of 18 after school, summer and expanded learning programs nationwide, based on a competitive application process.
