# **New Study Describes Effectiveness of Palm Beach County QIS**

Did you know that programs that quality rating for programs serving higher-need communities equal those in more affluent areas?

This is just one of the many findings that came out of a performance report for the Palm Beach County Quality Improvement System (QIS), one of the original design and demonstration partnerships for the YPQI. The report describes the Prime Time QIS, recent revisions to the quality assessment tool (PBC-PQA), and presents the following findings for over 100 afterschool providers.

These findings suggest that the Prime Time QIS is effective, is building and maintaining high levels of quality over time, is improving scores where targeted, and is helping to achieve equity effects by assuring high quality services in high need areas.
